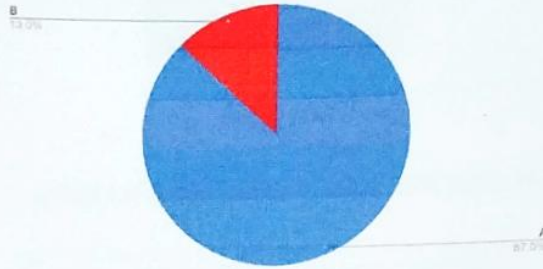

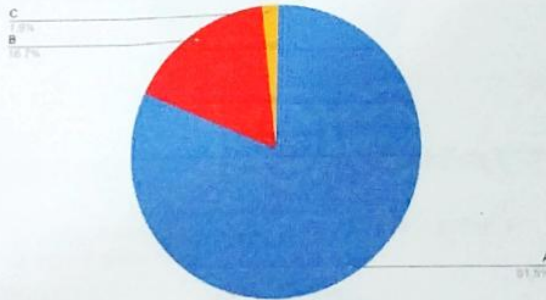
87% of the students opted A on course content and rest 13% opted B

Count of 2. Adequacy of course content - Course No 1

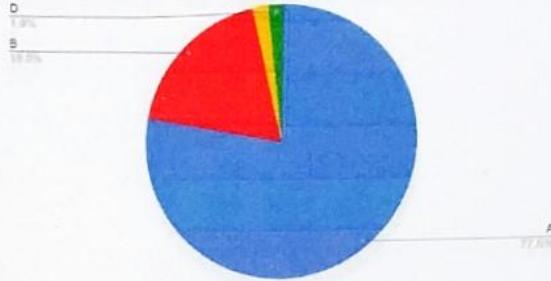


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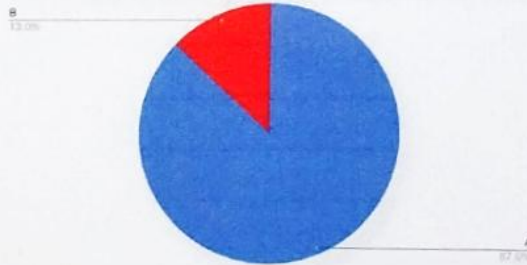
77.8% students opted A 18.5% opted B rest 1.9% opted D

(Group discussion, field exercises, role plays, use of audio-vi...



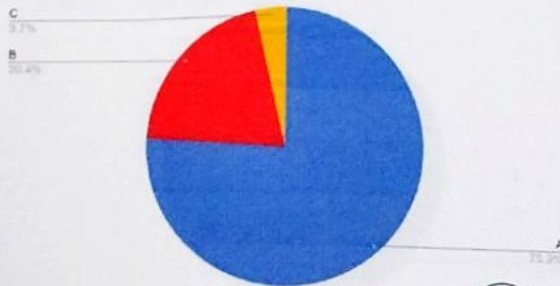
87% opted for A on Learning Value 13% opted for B

/Others) - Course No 1

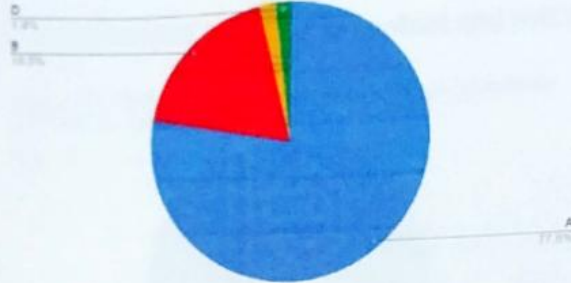


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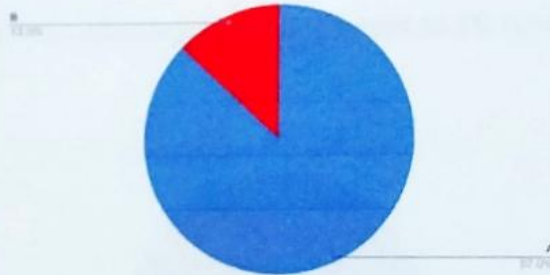
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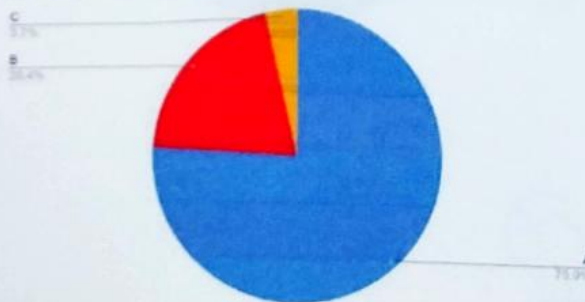
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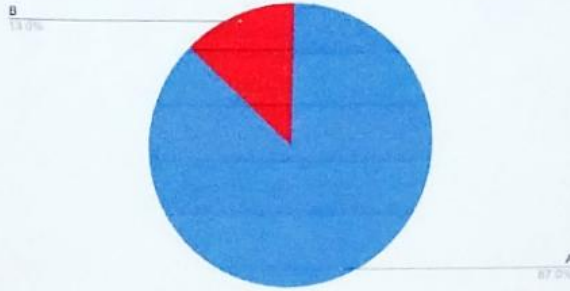


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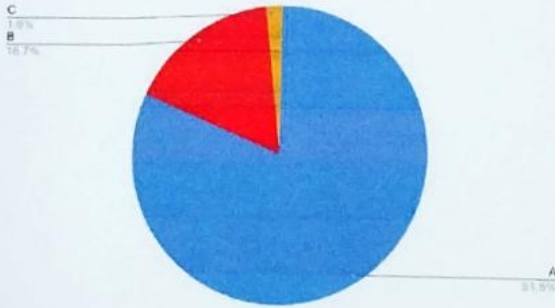
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
