Gautama in his Nyayasutra defines sabda or verbal testimony as aptopadeśaḥ sabdaḥ.'

The word upadeśa etymologically means that through which something is communicated. And that is the sentence that gives rise to the cognition of something unknown hitherto. Vātsyāyana in his commentary on the Nyāyasūtra 2.1.54 states that a sentence consists of several units in the form of two or more words. Thus sabda or verbal testimony is that which gives rise to the valid cognition of the sentence-meaning. And it is of the nature of a sentence consisting of a group of words. In his commentary on the Nyāyasūtra 3.2.62 he says that the articulate alphabetic sounds are the ultimate constituents of a sentence. There arises the auditory perception of each and every articulate alphabetic sound when it is uttered. One construes two or more sounds in the form of a word. From the cognition of the word one arrives at the cognition of its meaning. One then construes two or more words in the form of a sentence and from the cognition of it, one getsat the cognition of the relation of the word-meanings the relationwhich is the sentence-meaning. Navya-Nyaya school of thought is a unique school in Indian philosophy for its contribution and influence on other schools. This is because, the new age school developed a technical language that later became the language of all shastric discourses. The Navya-Nyaya language was used in different dialectics of ontologically opposite philosophies, for example, in the Advaitasiddhi by Madhusudana Sarasvati, in the Pūrvamimämsä by Khandadeva and in the Bhattarahasya and so on. It is also employed in later grammatical works of Pāṇinian School, poetics, Hindu law, and other branches of Indic studies. In one sense this language is considered as language of philosophy in India.It is therefore, strongly recommended to undertake the study of Navya-Nyaya language and the ontology of Vaiseşikas for the students of any Indian shastric school, without which one cannot paraphrase a single line of shastric monograph written in Navya-Nyaya style. Hundreds of monographs dealing with different subjects in different disciplines are authored in NavyaNyaya language that show the influence of this language on Indian schools of thought. The basic elements of Navya-Nyaya language have been dealt with in the present work.

In contemporary western philosophy, the language of logic has been developed and used extensively across disciplines as the language of Mathematics is used in all branches of science. In recent development, language of mathematics and logic has become one and took a new path in the form of Knowledge Representation medium in Artificial Intelligence of Computer Science. This area is a prominent field of study and research. The contrast and synergy between the Knowledge Representation methodologies of Navya-Nyaya technical language and western symbolic and mathematical language or First Order Predicate Calculus or conceptual graphs, are introduced to the Sanskrit readers in this work. The usage of graphical representation is a specialty of this book

Objective of the course

An introduction to the conceptual graphs method of representation, which is characteristic of the Western system of representation in parallel with justice, has also been added to the curriculum so that our students will be familiar with it.



Since this is the text of Prachina nyaya. Students will get an opportunity to understand the nuances of nyaya philosophy.


